"Ask Bubbe & Zayde"



Q I thought Rosh Hashanah was the Jewish new year and I just read that Tu B'shavat is the new year - How can there be more than one New Year?

A This is not strange at all; in America we have more than one new year - we have the calendar year new year in January, the school new year in September and many businesses start their new year at different times of the year.

Q How can a tree have a new year?

A Tu B'shavat is the new year for the purpose of calculating the age of trees for tithing. Lev. 19:23-25 states that fruit from trees may not be eaten during the first three years; the fourth year is for G-d and after that you can eat the fruit. Trees are considered to have aged a year each Tu B'shavat - it is their birthday.

Q How do people celebrate a tree's birthday?

A To celebrate Tu B'shavat some people eat a new fruit on the day, while others plant trees. When I was a little girl we used to go around with our blue JNF boxes collecting money for trees for Israel at this time of year.

Q What fruit should I eat on Tu B'shavat? Is an apple or banana OK?

A No, you need to eat fruits of Israel like olives, dates, grapes, figs and pomegranate.

Q What happens to the trees after you plant them?

A An ancient custom in Israel when a baby was born, the parents planted a tree in its honor. The tree was planted on Tu B'Shavat following the child's birth. If the baby was a boy, a cedar was planted. If the baby was a girl, a cypress was planted. As the children grew, so did the trees. When children got married the wood from the trees built their chupah (wedding canopy).

As the wood from the two trees were joined in the chupah so were the bride and groom in their marriage. _ _ _

HaKol Goes Digital

The trial run of the digital version of HaKol has pointed out a few minor problems (which have been corrected). The newsletter has been reformatted into one-page-at-a-time 8.5 x 11 pages. This will make it a snap to print out any or all pages and it will pop up larger on your monitors. (If you need some pointers on how to easily view HaKol, please read the separate article titled "Digital HaKol Pointers.") Again, all that's required is a computer program called "Adobe Reader." This is an absolutely free program that is available at Adobe.com if you don't already have it. On the homepage, click on "Get Adobe Reader" and follow the instructions.

In order to get you started, you need to send an email to hakol@fischoff.com. Please write "**HaKol Goes Digital**" in the subject line of your email and then make sure to send it. That's it! (If you want to include a publishable joke, we'll try to use that too!) You will soon be receiving both the digital version and the paper version of HaKol in the snail mail.

Digital HaKol Pointers

Q. What if the window is too small?

A. First make sure that the window is as high as possible and as far left as possible. To do this, click and hold anywhere on the top shaded strip of the window, then drag the window to the upper left. Then move your cursor to the lower right corner of the window. Click and hold using the left click button and then drag the window as far to the right and as low as possible.

Q. What if the type is too small to read?

A. There are several ways to enlarge the type. Look at the symbols and windows across the top. One small window probably shows a low number in it. (Possibly 25 or 50, meaning 25% or 50% actual size) Change the number to 100 or 200 or 400. You can make the type HUGE.

Another way to change the type size is while holding down the control key and tap the "+" key to enlarge or the "-" key to reduce size. Repeat several times and the type will grow to any size you want. These same commands can be used in many programs and at many internet sites.

Q. How do I move around easily?

A. Rather than using the scroll bars that appear on the right and bottom of your screen just click and hold anywhere in the file where there is white space (such as between columns) The cursor, which normally looks like a hand, "grabs" the page and then you can drag the page view in any direction. (Remember to keep holding down the left click button while dragging.)
